As usual, the club will provide the meats and soft drinks. Each participant is asked to bring along a side dish to share with about 10 or 12 others.

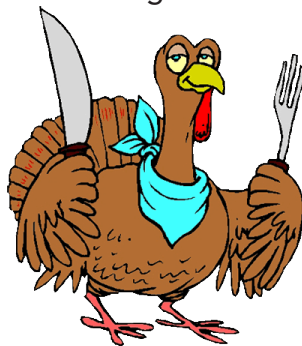
Items such as green bean casserole, noodle kugle, ambrosia, or scalloped potatoes are always popular as are a few desserts and beer or wine.
